For the last month, the practice has been closed for face to face consultations on the advice of the Chief Dental Officer for Scotland and Scottish Government. We are not idle during this time, most of the team have volunteered for redeployment to assist the NHS during the crisis and we are providing advice and emergency assistance by telephone every 9-5 Mon - Friday, we are also now developing other ways that we can temporarily help and consult remotely. Full details on what we can do until we are able to re-open are included later on in the newsletter.

Dental Emergencies

Throughout the Coronavirus pandemic crisis we are maintaining daily cover at the practice with a dentist always on hand. Although we are not permitted to see you face to face



we can provide advice and have the ability to remotely prescribe painkillers and antibiotics as necessary.

There are 2 central hubs in Lothian where treatment can be carried. You can only go there on referral after speaking with your own dental practice during the week or NHS 24 on 111 at week ends. In discussion with several of the dentists working at the hubs the range of treatment is very limited and the criteria for being offered an appointment are exceedingly strict. So far we have managed to help the vast majority of patents stave off, or temporarily hold problems at bay although this has been challenging on occasions.

As a result of being unable to see you directly, we know there is a significant body of important and urgent treatment to be completed when we are able to re open. The senior team are already planning how we can achieve this as quickly as possible when the time comes.

E-consult - don't wait for an emergency

While the nation is advised to stay home and access to dentistry as you traditionally know it is limited getting your home care and prevention right is critical. It is also good to be pro active and wherever possible head small problems off before they become big ones.

During this period our dentists are not only in the practice to help with toothache and dental emergencies they are also very happy to hear from you with any question of a dental nature that you have during this time. Whether that is the best way to deal with a minor niggle or grumble from a tooth, selecting and using the right products for home care or advice on the growth and development of your child's teeth we can still help.

E-consult: we now have a page on our website where you can upload any images from your smart phone of a problem area. You can send us up to 4 images up to 5Mb in size each which can help the dentist to assess the problem. <u>www.craigentinny.co.uk/advice</u>, or simply e-mail us.

Appointment Timings and Hygienist Visits

I appreciate many of our patients have been contacted to re book or move appointments over the last month. Although we hope it will not be too much longer before we can re open at least with a limited service. We are working to an unknown timetable and will of course be following advice on best practice as it becomes available.

Our aim once we have a date to work to is to prioritise initially seeing anyone who has had toothache / broken teeth or significant problem that is being nursed along during lockdown. Beyond this the team will be working hard to play catch up on visits that have been postponed or moved. I know that may of our patients who suffer from gum disease find that gum issues become more significant if they miss their usual 3 monthly or 6 monthly hygiene visit so again this is an area that we will prioritise as soon as we are able to re open.

For plan members it is our intention to make sure we complete the agreed number of examination and hygienist visits that your plan includes for the year. The lockdown may delay timings a little but we hope that we can catch up on this once we are re open

He is now finally back at home with his family while he completes his rehabilitation. I have very much enjoyed having a good number of lengthy conversations with him about dentistry, the practice and much more beyond.
